## **0472 Speech/Language Pathologist**

### **INTRODUCTION**

The Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) is a major Department of the Defense (DoD) field activity with worldwide scope. DoDEA delivers, in military communities worldwide, exemplary educational programs that inspire and prepare all students for success in a global environment. The Domestic Dependent Elementary and Secondary Schools (DDESS), located within the continental United States as well as Guam and Puerto Rico, and the Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS), located in foreign areas, provide a preschool through grade 12 educational program that inspires and prepares all students for success in a global environment. DoDEA is one of the largest, most diverse and geographically dispersed school jurisdictions. All schools in DoDEA are fully accredited and the DoDEA educational program consistently rates at or near the top in comparison with other school systems.

This standardized position description for Speech/Language Pathologist is appropriate for use at any DoDEA school. The Speech/Language Pathologist serves in a non-departmentalized environment with the responsibility for performing a variety of duties involved in testing, evaluation, diagnosis, and administration of therapy for students with speech and language disorders.

### **SUPERVISORY CONTROLS**

Work is performed under the supervision of the School Principal who approves the speech correction programs, insures compliance with the prescribed school policies, and provides advice and assistance regarding the handling of difficult learning and disciplinary issues. Additional technical guidance is provided by the district Special Education Coordinator. The teacher works independently and collaboratively within the framework of special education procedures. Effectiveness of therapy and day-to-day methods of instruction are subject to review by the Principal and Special Education Coordinator through observation and evaluation of program and overall results achieved.

### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Implements the speech/language therapy services of the school and provides instruction, assessment, and program planning for students identified with a range of disabilities including intellectual, physical, learning, and emotional. Works with the Case Study Committee (CSC) to provide interventions as part of pre-referral; administers screening tests in the areas of speech/language/literacy; and, as necessary, administers diagnostic speech/language assessments for students suspected of having a disability through a variety of assessment options (formal and informal). Interprets assessment results for team members and parents; uses assessment results and student performance to inform and differentiate instruction.

Provides speech/language therapy to students with a variety of speech/language impairments to include articulation, stuttering, voice, cleft palate, cerebral palsy, delayed speech, hard of

hearing, autism spectrum disorder, brain injury, and others as appropriate. In collaboration with classroom teachers and specialists, plans therapy schedules utilizing appropriate service delivery options to meet the needs of each student in a variety of setting including but not limited to therapy room, general education classroom, resource room, consultation, collaboration, and co-teaching.

Collaborates with classroom teachers to facilitate application of therapy gains into classroom activities; explains the connection between spoken and written language to literacy; works collaboratively with classroom teachers to identify children at risk for literacy (reading/writing) difficulties, and provides interventions to assist teachers in working with students with reading/writing difficulties including demonstrating interventions, explaining materials, and suggesting remedial activities.

Documents student progress through the use of formative and summative assessment tools; recognizes and respects diversity; demonstrates sensitivity and respect for each student's background experience and culture; maintains individual records using the school information system as appropriate.

Serves as an informational resource for teachers, students, parents, district personnel, and community organizations; responds to inquires and provides information, recommendations, and interpretations of student records.

Adheres to and implements safety and security procedures; creates a school climate conducive to learning, achievement, and citizenship; participates in professional development opportunities and committee activities to review, evaluate, and develop educational materials to improve the educational program; participates in DoDEA system-wide assessment programs; informs school administration of education deficiencies, critical issues, and emergencies; supervises students in outside activities, lunchroom, and bus arrivals and departures; and may be assigned to serve as a sponsor, coach, or consultant of an extracurricular activity.

Performs other duties as assigned.

### **OTHER SIGNIFICANT FACTS**

Incumbent will be required to respect the privacy and sensitivities of students and parents by controlling and restricting personal information to those with a "need to know."

The incumbent may be required to travel by military and/or commercial aircraft, land, or sea transportation to a variety of stateside and/or overseas locations for meetings and conferences. The incumbent may be subject to a variety of environmental conditions, to include the potential for exposure to acts of terrorism.
