Citizenship

- Explains factors that affect social change
- Identifies how group behavior can be influenced through voting

Culture

- Explores reasons for cultural diversity
- Discusses cultural pluralism in societal systems

Time, Continuity, and Change

- Describes changing relationships between people and the environment
- Describes the problems of gender, age, and race in societal systems

Space and Place

- Assesses how location affects one's perception of the world
- Explains interrelationship between geographical location and behavior

Individual Development and Identity

- Evaluates the effects of social class on individual aspirations
- Explains how socialization transmits cultural beliefs and values

Individuals, Groups, and Institutions

- Analyzes the development of various institutions
- Identifies societies' sanctions for unacceptable behavior

Production, Distribution, and Consumption

- Describes how economic development impacts societal values
- Analyzes social problems that arise from economic imbalance

Power, Authority, and Governance

- Describes how different forms of government address social issues
- Identifies means to manage conflict, establish order and security

Science, Technology, and Society

- Uses scientific theory to examine social issues and problems
- Evaluates how science and technology have transformed the world

Global Connections

- Analyzes the interrelationships between global institutions
- Identifies and discusses universal human rights issues
