

Social Studies: Asian Culture

Citizenship

- Exhibits tolerance for people from other cultures
- Demonstrates awareness of the rights of citizens in societies

Culture

- Recognizes the diversity of Asian cultures
- Interprets values that pose obstacles to cross-cultural understanding

Time, Continuity, and Change

- Traces the arrivals of people to Asian lands
- Discusses economic and social changes resulting from contact with foreign nations

Space and Place

- Gives geographic explanations for the distribution of Asia's population
- Contrasts life in rural and urban areas

Individual Development and Identity

- Evaluates factors that affect an individual's view of the world
- Describes experiences that broaden perceptions of Asian cultures

Individuals, Groups, and Institutions

- Assesses how minority rights have been impacted by environmental changes
- Explains how institutions influence people's culture

Production, Distribution, and Consumption

- Analyzes how trade is affected by relationships among Asian nations
- Describes the impact of international policies on economic development

Power, Authority, and Governance

- Compares political and economic systems in Asia
- Evaluates the concept of universal human rights in Asia

Science, Technology, and Society

- Evaluates conflicting ideas between traditional Asian societies and modern "Western" culture
- Discusses impact of education on science and technology

Global Connections

- Describes how trade contributed to the exchanges of culture
- Analyzes the impact of foreign influence on Asian cultures
