

Social Studies: Street Law

Citizenship

- Evaluates how citizens' behaviors exemplify ideals of democratic government
- Defines responsibilities of a democratic citizen

Culture

- Examines the effects of prejudice on the individual and group
- Analyzes why behaviors do not occur in isolation

Time, Continuity, and Change

- Evaluates Supreme Court decisions within their historical contexts

Space and Place

- Assesses how location affects one's perception of the world
- Recognizes the relationship between geographical location and behavior

Individual Development and Identity

- Identifies how behaviors are sanctioned and rewarded in society
- Use formal and informal mechanisms to resolve disputes

Individuals, Groups, and Institutions

- Analyzes tensions between expressions of individuality and social conformity
- Identifies societies' sanctions for unacceptable behavior

Production, Distribution, and Consumption

- Describes how economic development affects society
- Analyzes social problems that arise from economic imbalance

Power, Authority, and Governance

- Investigates the concept and development of basic human rights
- Examines principles underlying our Constitution, laws, and legal system

Science, Technology, and Society

- Examines how laws affect scientific and technological applications.
- Analyzes how science and technology influence the attitudes of society

Global Connections

- Identifies and discusses universal issues of universal human rights
- Evaluates the effects of media on our perceptions of the world
