- Summarizes how geography and location affect historical events
- Uses geographic tools to interpret data about American regions

Individual Development and Identity

- Analyzes how geographic location molds personal identity
- Discusses how societal factors influence an individual

Individuals, Groups, and Institutions

- Explains how social institutions promote the common good
- Identifies how reform movement affects societal values

Production, Distribution, and Consumption

- Describes how inventions influenced economic development
- Applies the concept of supply and demand to a historical event

Power, Authority, and Governance

- Explains how and why laws and governments have changed
- Identifies key leaders and major functions of the government

Science, Technology, and Society

- Describes influence of science and technology
- Explains the need for government regulations

Global Connections

- Identifies factors that contribute to cooperation among societies
- Explores global issues
