Vocabulary Challenge (Students prepare words for Vocabulary Challenge and exchange words today and have the challenge in the next class)

Students form four groups; each group assigned one of four chapters; review notes of memorable or puzzling words and make list of 3-5 words from that chapter, noting page number and sentence; discuss meaning and other possible uses; exchange lists with another group; groups discuss new lists; I circulate and write down words on slips of paper (if the words they choose really don't seem puzzling or memorable, I'll ask them to find others); the two groups become a team; then I draw words out of each team's basket of words and they explain the words and their context in the book (alternate between two teams; the whole class hears all of the words again in a way that helps them to remember them); I don't do points with this, but some students like to keep score—I don't make a big deal out of competition, but the students are still pretty motivated
