DoDEA's 6th Grade:

Study of the Disappearing Wetlands

*Online Professional Development, Train-the-Trainer Workshops,
and Jason-Developed Curriculum Materials*

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Contractor shall provide all personnel, materials, and other items necessary to perform all tasks and functions as defined in this PWS. The Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) needs to provide 6th grade students with excellent, problem-solving, inquiry-based, standards-based life science instruction. Consequently, DoDEA requires:

- Comprehensive, standards-based online professional development focused on the nation's wetlands with differentiated coursework for those 6th grade teachers who possess general elementary certification and those who possess secondary science certification.
- Professional development—employing train-the-trainer model—in the area of hands-on, inquiry-based instruction using graphing calculators and temperature probes.

2.0 BACKGROUND

DoDEA 6th graders in elementary schools with little access to laboratories require more hands-on science instruction. Most of DoDEA's 6th grade teachers have general elementary certification and require professional development in science content and pedagogy, particularly in providing students with opportunities to do "real" science, that is, hands-on, inquiry-based activities. To meet this requirement, DoDEA needs systemwide professional development activities for 6th grade teachers and hands-on life science activities for 6th grade students that focus on the disappearing wetlands.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor shall:

- 3.1 Ensure that the online courses and train-the-trainer workshops are aligned to DoDEA's 6th grade life science curriculum standards (attached).
- 3.2 Ensure that the Jason curriculum materials for the workshops are purchased and delivered as specified in Deliverables (para. 5.0).
- 3.3 Provide the following online professional development courses:
 - Introduction to the Disappearing Wetlands online course for 338 teachers

- A problem-based, wetlands-focused online course for 338 teachers
- At least four other online courses related to the nation's wetlands from which 100 teachers and science liaisons can choose (that is, taking one course per person).

4.0 TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor shall deliver online courses on a web-based platform that will not require additional training for end-users to access and utilize. Any existing course or video shall be able to convert to streaming video and be compatible with the hardware and operating system requirements listed below.

5.0 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 Train-the-Trainer Workshops: The Contractor and DoDEA shall determine mutually agreeable times during the summer of 2005 and September 2005 to perform the two sets of 4-day trainings in each Area on (1) Vernier probes and TI-73 graphing calculators and (2) inquiry-based science. DoDEA shall send 80 participants to each of the two workshops 20 participants from the domestic schools, 20 participants from the schools in the Europe area, and 40 participants from the schools in the Pacific area.
- 5.2 Workshop Facilities, Travel and Lodging: For the workshops in Peachtree City, Georgia and Okinawa, DoDEA shall provide the facilities for the workshops. For the workshops in Wiesbaden, Germany; the Contractor shall provide facilities for the workshop.
- 5.3 Online Courses: The Contractor shall provide the introduction to the disappearing wetlands online course for 338 DoDEA teachers, a problem-based, wetlands-focused online course for 338 DoDEA teachers, and at least four other related online courses from which 100 teachers and science liaisons can select (one per person). The Contracting Officer Representative (COR) shall coordinate the enrollment of DoDEA educators with the Contractor.
- 5.4 Jason Curriculum Materials, The Contractor shall distribute 338 sets of Jason-developed materials to DoDEA schools and district offices at the workshops and by shipping. The Contractor should expect to ship materials to approximately 100 schools. The COR will provide the Contractor the final list of quantities and shipping addresses.
- 5.5 Subscription Services: The Contractor shall provide a one-year subscription service for 338 DoDEA classrooms, area/district liaisons, and Mathematics and Sciences Branch at DoDEA, Headquarters. The subscription service shall run for 12 months from the date of award. The COR will provide the necessary contact information for the 338 sites to the Contractor.

5.6 Meetings: Initial teleconference shall occur between the COR and Jason Foundation staff. (See 6.0 Deliverables below.)

FAR 52.212-4 -CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS (OCT 2003)

(a) *Inspection/Acceptance.* The Contractor shall only tender for acceptance those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The Government reserves the right to inspect or test any supplies or services that have been tendered for acceptance. The Government may require repair or replacement of nonconforming supplies or reperformance of nonconforming services at no increase in contract price. The Government must exercise its post-acceptance rights --

(1) Within a reasonable time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and

(2) Before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.

(b) *Assignment.* The Contractor or its assignee may assign its rights to receive payment due as a result of performance of this contract to a bank, trust company, or other financing institution, including any Federal lending agency in accordance with the Assignment of Claims Act (31 U.S.C.3727). However, when a third party makes payment (*e.g.*, use of the Governmentwide commercial purchase card), the Contractor may not assign its rights to receive payment under this contract.

(c) *Changes.* Changes in the terms and conditions of this contract may be made only by written agreement of the parties.

(d) *Disputes.* This contract is subject to the Contract Disputes Act of 1978, as amended (41 U.S.C. 601-613). Failure of the parties to this contract to reach agreement on any request for equitable adjustment, claim, appeal or action arising under or relating to this contract shall be a dispute to be resolved in accordance with the clause at FAR 52.233-1, Disputes, which is incorporated herein by reference. The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any dispute arising under the contract.

(e) *Definitions.* The clause at FAR 52.202-1, Definitions, is incorporated herein by reference.

(f) *Excusable delays.* The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence such as, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch, and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.

(g) *Invoice.*

(1) The Contractor shall submit an original invoice and three copies (or electronic invoice, if authorized) to the address designated in the contract to receive invoices. An invoice must include --

(i) Name and address of the Contractor;

(ii) Invoice date and number;

(iii) Contract number, contract line item number and, if applicable, the order number;

(iv) Description, quantity, unit of measure, unit price and extended price of the items delivered;

(v) Shipping number and date of shipment, including the bill of lading number and weight of shipment if shipped on Government bill of lading;

(vi) Terms of any discount for prompt payment offered;

(vii) Name and address of official to whom payment is to be sent;

(viii) Name, title, and phone number of person to notify in event of defective invoice; and

(ix) Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN). The Contractor shall include its TIN on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.

(x) Electronic funds transfer (EFT) banking information.

(A) The Contractor shall include EFT banking information on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.

(B) If EFT banking information is not required to be on the invoice, in order for the invoice to be a proper invoice, the Contractor shall have submitted correct EFT banking information in accordance with the

applicable solicitation provision, contract clause (e.g., 52.232-33, Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer—Central Contractor Registration, or 52.232-34, Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer—Other Than Central Contractor Registration), or applicable agency procedures.

(C) EFT banking information is not required if the Government waived the requirement to pay by EFT.

(2) Invoices will be handled in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act (31 U.S.C. 3903) and Office of Management and Budget (OMB) prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR part 1315.

(h) *Patent indemnity.* The Contractor shall indemnify the Government and its officers, employees and agents against liability, including costs, for actual or alleged direct or contributory infringement of, or inducement to infringe, any United States or foreign patent, trademark or copyright, arising out of the performance of this contract, provided the Contractor is reasonably notified of such claims and proceedings.

(i) *Payment.*

(1) Items accepted. Payment shall be made for items accepted by the Government that have been delivered to the delivery destinations set forth in this contract.

(2) Prompt Payment. The Government will make payment in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act (31 U.S.C. 3903) and prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR Part 1315.

(3) Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). If the Government makes payment by EFT, see 52.212-5(b) for the appropriate EFT clause.

(4) Discount. In connection with any discount offered for early payment, time shall be computed from the date of the invoice. For the purpose of computing the discount earned, payment shall be considered to have been made on the date which appears on the payment check or the specified payment date if an electronic funds transfer payment is made.

(5) Overpayments. If the Contractor becomes aware of a duplicate contract financing or invoice payment or that the Government has otherwise overpaid on a contract financing or invoice payment, the Contractor shall immediately notify the Contracting Officer and request instructions for disposition of the overpayment.

(j) *Risk of loss.* Unless the contract specifically provides otherwise, risk of loss or damage to the supplies provided under this contract shall remain with the Contractor until, and shall pass to the Government upon:

(1) Delivery of the supplies to a carrier, if transportation is f.o.b. origin; or

(2) Delivery of the supplies to the Government at the destination specified in the contract, if transportation is f.o.b. destination.

(k) *Taxes.* The contract price includes all applicable Federal, State, and local taxes and duties.

(l) *Termination for the Government's convenience.* The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred which reasonably could have been avoided.

(m) *Termination for cause.* The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

(n) *Title.* Unless specified elsewhere in this contract, title to items furnished under this contract shall pass to the Government upon acceptance, regardless of when or where the Government takes physical possession.

(o) *Warranty.* The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract.

(p) *Limitation of liability.* Except as otherwise provided by an express warranty, the Contractor will not be liable to the Government for consequential damages resulting from any defect or deficiencies in accepted items.

(q) *Other compliances.* The Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, executive orders, rules and regulations applicable to its performance under this contract.

(r) *Compliance with laws unique to Government contracts.* The Contractor agrees to comply with 31 U.S.C. 1352 relating to limitations on the use of appropriated funds to influence certain Federal contracts; 18 U.S.C. 431 relating to officials not to benefit; 40 U.S.C. 327, *et seq.*, Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act; 41 U.S.C. 51-58, Anti-Kickback Act of 1986; 41 U.S.C. 265 and 10 U.S.C. 2409 relating to whistleblower protections; 49 U.S.C. 40118, Fly American; and 41 U.S.C. 423 relating to procurement integrity.

(s) *Order of precedence.* Any inconsistencies in this solicitation or contract shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:

- (1) The schedule of supplies/services.
- (2) The Assignments, Disputes, Payments, Invoice, Other Compliances, and Compliance with Laws Unique to Government Contracts paragraphs of this clause.
- (3) The clause at 52.212-5.
- (4) Addenda to this solicitation or contract, including any license agreements for computer software.
- (5) Solicitation provisions if this is a solicitation.
- (6) Other paragraphs of this clause.
- (7) The Standard Form 1449.
- (8) Other documents, exhibits, and attachments.
- (9) The specification.

(t) *Central Contractor Registration (CCR).*

(1) Unless exempted by an addendum to this contract, the Contractor is responsible during performance and through final payment of any contract for the accuracy and completeness of the data within the CCR database, and for any liability resulting from the Government's reliance on inaccurate or incomplete data. To remain registered in the CCR database after the initial registration, the Contractor is required to review and update on an annual basis from the date of initial registration or subsequent updates its information in the CCR database to ensure it is current, accurate and complete. Updating information in the CCR does not alter the terms and conditions of this contract and is not a substitute for a properly executed contractual document.

(ii) If the Contractor fails to comply with the requirements of paragraph (t)(2)(i) of this clause, or fails to perform the agreement at paragraph (t)(2)(i)(C) of this clause, and, in the absence of a properly executed novation or change-of-name agreement, the CCR information that shows the Contractor to be other than the Contractor indicated in the contract will be considered to be incorrect information within the meaning of the "Suspension of Payment" paragraph of the electronic funds transfer (EFT) clause of this contract.

(6) The Contractor shall not change the name or address for EFT payments or manual payments, as appropriate, in the CCR record to reflect an assignee for the purpose of assignment of claims (see FAR Subpart 32.8, Assignment of Claims). Assignees shall be separately registered in the CCR database. Information provided to the Contractor's CCR record that indicates payments, including those made by EFT, to an ultimate recipient other than that Contractor will be considered to be incorrect information within the meaning of the "Suspension of payment" paragraph of the EFT clause of this contract.

- S2c:** explains how the effects of science and technology affect cultural development, innovation and human history.

S3: Science in Personal and Social Perspectives

The student demonstrates an understanding of safety and risks and benefits associated with natural and personal hazards; that is, the student:

- S3a:** demonstrates personal and group safety and resource conservation.
- S3b:** compares the safety precautions needed during different natural hazards.
- S3c:** describes the risks, costs, and benefits of human decisions related to natural hazards.
- S3d:** explores causes of environmental degradation and resources depletion.

S4: Science and Technology

The student demonstrates an understanding about science and technology, and the nature of technological design; that is, the student:

- S4a:** explores how societal challenges may drive scientific research.
- S4b:** designs and conducts a test on an invention (or existing product) based on specified criteria.
- S4c:** compares the intended benefits and unintended consequences of technology and how it impacts society.
- S4d:** describes how technology responds to societal needs.

S5: Physical Science

The student demonstrates a conceptual understanding of matter, motions and forces, and transfer of energy; that is, the student:

- S5a:** investigates how some common elements combine to form mixtures and compounds.
- S5b:** identifies and illustrates the multiple forces on the movement, speed, and direction of an object.
- S5c:** communicates how energy can be transferred through conduction, convection, and radiation, and how objects have potential energy and kinetic energy.

S6: Life Science

The student demonstrates a conceptual understanding of the structure and function of living systems, populations and ecosystems; that is, the student:

- S6a:** compares and contrasts structure and function in single celled and multicellular organisms.
- S6b:** compares asexual and sexual reproduction and infers their role in the survival of a species.
- S6c:** assesses the relationships among producers, consumers, and decomposers in ecosystems.

S7: Earth and Space Sciences

The student demonstrates a conceptual understanding of the Earth's systems, history, and place in the solar system; that is, the student:

- S7a:** explains the processes of the Earth that produce gradual changes, such as weathering, erosion, and the development of landforms.
- S7b:** evaluates the impact of atmospheric changes (clouds, air masses and precipitation) and other factors (oceans, meteors, and glaciers) on weather, climate, and landforms.
- S7c:** catalogues the planets of this solar system including Earth.
