**I. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE:**

The Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) serves the educational needs of the dependents of the military and civilian employees stationed abroad and in the continental United States through its Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS) and the Domestic Dependents Elementary and Secondary Schools (DDESS). DoDEA schools enroll approximately 48,000 total students annually in Middle School Mathematics (grade 6); Middle School Mathematics (grade 7); Middle School Mathematics (grade 8); Algebra I (grades 9-12); Geometry (grades 9-12); Algebra II (grades 9-12); Math Analysis/Precalculus (grades 9-12); Advanced Placement (AP) Calculus (grades 9-12); Advanced Placement (AP) Statistics (grades 9-12). These school systems offer a typical American education and use materials and equipment comparable to other stateside schools.

**II. CONTRACT SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES:**

DoDEA requires textbooks for the teaching of mathematics in Middle School Mathematics (grade 6); Middle School Mathematics (grade 7); Middle School Mathematics (grade 8); Geometry (grades 9-12); Algebra II (grades 9-12); Math Analysis/Precalculus (grades 9-12); Advanced Placement (AP) Calculus (grades 9-12); Advanced Placement (AP) Statistics (grades 9-12) instructional materials which supports the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics' (NCTM) *Principles and Standards for School Mathematics (PSSM)* and for the Advanced Placement courses the College Board AP Course Description. DoDEA also requires support through professional development that shall effectively help teachers implement the newly adopted curriculum materials.

The contractor shall provide published copyrighted instructional materials, software and services for all 6-12 mathematics courses adopted by DoDEA. This adoption shall consist of core instructional materials (student textbooks, student manuals, teacher editions, teacher resource packages, assessment materials, multimedia and technology resources, and digital courseware such as on-line, CD-ROM or downloadable material, and software). The contractor shall also provide related professional development as requested prior to the full implementation of the adopted materials in the classroom.

It is anticipated that materials will be purchased before or on June 2005 for purposes of pre-implementation training and introduction into DoDEA schools in school year 2005-2006 (i.e., August 2005 through June 2006). Licenses for on-line digital mode(s) and software shall include compatibility with DoDEA school computers operating systems and maintenance support that shall be renewable for the four years subsequent to the base period of performance. Maintenance is defined as automatic distribution of software upgrades and revisions that can be accomplished using Internet, email, or CD-ROM/DVD media.

### *Technical Hotline Support*

Professional Development Plan: Professional Development Plan: The contractor, in collaboration with the COR at DoDEA HQ, shall identify a team of facilitators with in-depth knowledge of National Council of Mathematics Teachers (NCTM) *Principle and Standards for School Mathematics* (PSSM) and new DoDEA's Mathematics Standards <http://www.odedodea.edu/instruction/curriculum/math/stands.htm>; advanced academic and teaching credentials; knowledge of curriculum, instruction, assessment, and mathematics content relative to grades 6-12; and extensive experience in delivering a variety of instructional strategies and technology into the learning environment. The facilitators shall conduct pre-implementation training, implementation training, and follow-up training of district/area mathematics liaisons, instructional system specialists and middle/secondary teachers of mathematics. The purpose of this training is to provide district/area mathematics liaisons, instructional systems specialists, and teachers the knowledge and skills in using the adopted curriculum materials to directly support DoDEA's Mathematics Standards and Best Practices as outlined in the DoDEA's Quality Indicator Map (QIM) <http://www.odedodea.edu/instruction/curriculum/QI%20Map%20final.doc>.

Scope and content of the Trainer-of-Trainer training and teacher Professional Development Plan shall include the following components:

- Correlate new DoDEA Mathematics Standards <http://www.odedodea.edu/instruction/curriculum/math/stands.htm> into unit modules answering the following questions competently:
  - What do I want students to know and be able to do?
  - How will I measure if the students have met the new DoDEA Mathematics Standards?
  - What instructional techniques, activities, and materials will help all students to meet the new DoDEA Mathematics Standards?
  - How will I examine student work to provide feedback and document student progress toward "Achievement of the Standard"?
- Apply DoDEA's Quality Indicator Map best practices for curriculum, instruction, and environment to develop a unit of instruction that demonstrates the following:
  - C-1. Standards provide the foundation for the design, content, and delivery of instruction.
  - C-2. The teacher possesses content knowledge, an understanding of its relation to standards, and a facility in adapting content to allow all students access to standards.
  - C-4. Approved and appropriate materials correlated to standards are used for instruction.
  - I-2. Students are meaningfully engaged throughout the learning process.
  - I-4. Varied questioning strategies are used to support student learning.
  - I-6. Varied teaching strategies are used to support inquiry, higher order thinking, and problem solving.
  - I-7. Technology is meaningfully integrated throughout instruction to support student achievement of the standards.

- E-1. The teacher promotes a safe and flexible physical environment, meeting the needs of diverse learners.
- Design essential performance task, aligned to the new DoDEA Mathematics Standards, that engages students; simulates a real world context; inspires curiosity; and provokes critical and creative thinking.
  - Task-analyzes should delineate precisely what a student should know and be able to do as prerequisites for achieving the concepts and skills of a performance task.
  - In planning teaching activities that will enable students to achieve the performance tasks areas of the adopted text and other appropriate resources will be utilized.
  - Incorporate multiple assessment strategies, in addition to performance tasks.

For each curriculum adoption, the contractor shall prepare an in-depth Professional Development Plan. The Plan shall explain how its team of identified facilitators shall train district/area mathematics liaisons, instructional systems specialists, and teachers in its curriculum materials during pre-implementation training, implementation training, and follow-up training; and shall provide a schedule for the conduct of these professional development and support activities.

Training of district/area liaisons and instructional system specialists shall include modules in the form of lesson plans, transparencies, support materials, and videos for their use during training. Throughout the life of this contract, the contractor shall provide facilitators for consultations (e.g., VTC, video, telephone, etc.), with district/area liaisons and instructional systems specialist personnel as requested, at no additional cost to DoDEA.

In addition to in-depth professional development for district/area mathematics liaisons and instructional systems specialists, the contractor shall also be responsible for providing similar professional development training and support for the number of teachers identified in Section III regarding the use of its instructional materials.

The Professional Development Plan encompassing these various elements shall be finalized and delivered to the COR not later than 60 days after the date of contract award.

Pre-Implementation Professional Development and Support: Pre-Implementation development and support shall consist of learning prior to the actual use of instructional materials in the classroom. During Pre-Implementation training, the contractor's facilitators shall provide separate sessions of professional development training and support to mathematics liaisons/instructional systems specialists and to teachers. This training shall address the organization and content of adopted curriculum materials and how they should be used in the classroom. To facilitate this effort, the contractor shall prepare a hard copy brochure and video/CD ROM for each grade level or course to provide an overview of its adopted materials. Each grade level video or CD, of approximately one hour each, demonstrating a model lesson using the materials, including best practices such as flexible grouping, manipulatives, and/or technology, should be developed to support the implementation plan. During the course of preparing the brochure and video/CD ROM, the contractor shall confer with DoDEA officials; present to them a preview of it; and incorporate any recommended changes DoDEA may have prior to its presentation during the course of Pre-Implementation training. The contractor shall complete Pre-Implementation Development and Support training to district/area mathematics liaisons and instructional systems specialists no later than 90 days after the date of contract award. The contractor shall complete Pre-Implementation Development and Support training for all DoDEA mathematics teachers in grades 6-12 no later than 1 August 2005.

Implementation Development and Support: Implementation development shall involve travel to conduct site visits by the contractor's facilitators to all areas to include Europe, Pacific, and the continental United States. The contractor's facilitators shall make an initial site visit to each area no later than 8 months after the date of award of Option Year 1. During each site visit, facilitators shall confer with school personnel, both individually and collectively, and district personnel, as appropriate; make classroom visitations; present demonstration lessons; and participate at a parent forum to discuss the new adoption. (4) If this contract, order, or blanket purchase agreement does not require preparation of a receiving report on a prescribed form, the Contractor shall include on the invoice the following information at the line item level, in addition to that required in paragraph (c) (1) of this clause:

(i) Ship-To Point.

(ii) Mark-For Point.

(iii) FEDSTRIP/MILSTRIP document number, if in the contract.

(5) Where a receiving report is not required, the Contractor shall include a copy of the invoice in each shipment.

(d) Certification of invoice. The Contractor certifies by submitting an invoice to the Government that the supplies being billed to the Government have been shipped or delivered in accordance with shipping instructions issued by the ordering officer, in the quantities shown on the invoice, and that the supplies are in the quantity and of the quality designated by the contract, order, or blanket purchase agreement.

(e) Fast pay container identification. The Contractor shall mark all outer shipping containers "FAST PAY."

FAR 52.215-20 -- REQUIREMENTS FOR COST OR PRICING DATA OR INFORMATION  
OTHER THAN COST OR PRICING DATA ALT IV (OCT 1997)

- (a) Submission of cost or pricing data is not required.
- (b) Provide price proposal information described in Section IV, Submission Instructions (a).

9. FAR 52.216-18 ORDERING (OCT 1995)

- (a) Any supplies and services to be furnished under this contract shall be ordered by issuance of delivery orders or task orders by the individuals or activities designated in the Schedule. Such orders may be issued from date of award through 60 months.
  - (b) All delivery orders or task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of this contract. In the event of conflict between a delivery order or task order and this contract, the contract shall control.
  - (c) If mailed, a delivery order or task order is considered "issued" when the Government deposits the order in the mail. Orders may be issued orally, by facsimile, or by electronic commerce methods only if authorized in the Schedule.

FAR 52.216-19 ORDER LIMITATIONS (OCT 1995)

- (a) Minimum order. When the Government requires supplies or services covered by this contract in an amount of less than 1 each, the Government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the Contractor obligated to furnish, those supplies or services under the contract.
  - (b) Maximum order. The Contractor is not obligated to honor--
    - (1) Any order for a single item in excess of \$30,000
    - (2) Any order for a combination of items in excess of \$100,000 or
    - (3) A series of orders from the same ordering office within 15 days that together call for quantities exceeding the limitation in subparagraph (1) or (2) of this section.
  - (c) If this is a requirements contract (i.e., includes the Requirements clause at subsection 52.216-21 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR)), the Government is not required to order a part of any one requirement from the Contractor if that requirement exceeds the maximum- order limitations in paragraph (b) of this section.
  - (d) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, the Contractor shall honor any order exceeding the maximum order limitations in paragraph (b), unless that order (or orders) is returned to the ordering office within 15 days after issuance, with written notice stating the Contractor's intent not to ship the item (or items) called for and the reasons. Upon receiving this notice, the Government may acquire the supplies or services from another source.

The quantities of supplies or services specified in the Schedule are estimates only and are not purchased by this contract. Except as this contract may otherwise provide, if the Government's requirements do not result in orders in the quantities described as "estimated" or "maximum" in the Schedule, that fact shall not constitute the basis for an equitable price adjustment.
  - (b) Delivery or performance shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. Subject to any limitations in the Order Limitations clause or elsewhere in this
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contract, the Contractor shall furnish to the Government all supplies or services specified in the Schedule and called for by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. The Government may issue orders requiring delivery to multiple destinations or performance at multiple locations.

(c) Except as this contract otherwise provides, the Government shall order from the Contractor all the supplies or services specified in the Schedule that are required to be purchased by the Government activity or activities specified in the Schedule.

(d) The Government is not required to purchase from the Contractor requirements in excess of any limit on total orders under this contract.

(e) If the Government urgently requires delivery of any quantity of an item before the earliest date that delivery may be specified under this contract, and if the Contractor will not accept an order providing for the accelerated delivery, the Government may acquire the urgently required goods or services from another source.

(f) Any order issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that period shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and Government's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the same extent as if the order were completed during the contract's effective period; provided, that the Contractor shall not be required to make any deliveries under this contract after 31 Dec 2010.

#### FAR 52.217-6 OPTION FOR INCREASED QUANTITY (MAR 1989)

The Government may increase the quantity of supplies called for in the Schedule at the unit price specified. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor within 30 days. Delivery of the added items shall continue at the same rate as the like items called for under the contract, unless the parties otherwise agree.

#### FAR 52.217-7 OPTION FOR INCREASED QUANTITY--SEPARATELY PRICED LINE ITEM (MAR 1989)

The Government may require the delivery of the numbered line item, identified in the Schedule as an option item, in the quantity and at the price stated in the Schedule. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor within 30 days. Delivery of added items shall continue at the same rate that like items are called for under the contract, unless the parties otherwise agree.

(c) The total duration of this contract, including the exercise of any options under this clause, shall not exceed 60 months.

(b) If the Government is not shown as the consignor or the consignee, the annotation shall be: "Transportation is for the Please contact the Transportation Office at 1-800-456-5507, EMAIL ADDRESS IS Delivery@ddc.dla.mil and the actual total transportation charges paid to the carrier(s) by the consignor or consignee shall be reimbursed by the Government, pursuant to cost-reimbursement contract No. Contract Number will be identified at the time of award. This may be confirmed by contacting DoD Education Activity, Procurement Division, 4040 N. Fairfax Drive, 4th Floor, and Arlington, VA 22203-1635. "
