





Principal's Highlights

McNair's greatest technological achievement during the 1999-2000 school year was networking the school. The WinSchool Program has been used this school year to generate report cards for third and fourth graders and to provide the school counselor access to student registration data. School safety was also a major focus for this school year. The principal attended training sessions to assist in the development of a school safety program. The School Safety Committee revised the school's safety plan and the plan was practiced by all staff members and students. Several new after-school clubs were created this school year. The Bird Watching Club and the Ecology Club have been co-sponsored by parents and staff members. The Young Astronauts Club continues to very popular with students. Improving math achievement for the general school population and for minority students has been a goal of the school this year. A part-time math resource teacher has been added to the staff. The Achievement Club has provided additional time in the computer lab for students in need of remedial math instruction. We look forward to the challenge of setting and obtaining many academic goals in the upcoming year.

Goal 3: Student Achievement And Citizenship

Benchmark 3.10: Demonstrate student technological proficiency.....
Student Technology Standards were used to guide instruction, plan staff development, and evaluate student skills. Electronic portfolio entries were developed by fourth grade students. The Internet is available throughout the school and is used by students for research.

Goal 4: Math And Science Achievement

Benchmark 4.3: Increase student proficiency in math and science.....
A math resource teacher has worked with students in third and fourth grades to help them develop targeted math skills. The STAR Math Program and a before-school Achievement Club provides students with additional help in math. Science rubrics were used in evaluating students' science projects.

Goal 7: Teacher Education and Professional Development

Benchmark 7.1: Provide professional development structure for educators.....
Staff members earned license renewal credit for developing classroom web pages. Other staff development topics include using Outlook and the Internet. Classroom teachers attended sessions in the Orton-Gillingham Approach to Teaching Phonics. Four staff members are working on graduate degrees at local universities.




Goal 10: Organizational Development

The school has been networked throughout. Technology has been used for instruction, record keeping, and communication. Special education staff members have been trained to use Excent software to develop IEPs.
