



**DeLalio Hits The BEACH!**

Students, staff and families of DeLalio Elementary School decided during SY 98-99 to read 1,000,000 minutes at home. The bad news is that we didn't make it...the good news is the we tried it again and THIS year we read almost 1,250,000 minutes by May 1, 2000! Our read at home program is SURF (Students Uncovering Reading Fun) so we needed water, sand and sun to celebrate! On May 11, 2000, all 325 students grades PreK through 5 and their teachers held school on West Onslow Beach, Camp Lejeune, NC. Math became measuring how high a kite could fly. Reading encompassed skilled story tellers spinning their tales in a beach shelter. Every student became an artist creating sand-casting and plaster sculptures. And, of course, the science! Bivalve shells, shark skeletons, corral, and even dive-bombing seagulls provided instructional materials.

Our instructional focus for SY 00-01 is guaranteeing that every child will read on grade level or have an individual reading plan. Can you imagine the celebration when we hit that target?!

**Goal 3: Student Achievement And Citizenship**

*Benchmark 3.10: Demonstrate student technological proficiency*.....  
Classrooms now house six computers networked and eagerly await fiber connection to the outside world. Internet access is provided by a gateway in the media center. Power Point is the tool of choice for fourth and fifth grade content area projects while Kindergarten and first graders squirm their way through Wiggleworks.

**Goal 4: Math And Science Achievement**

*Benchmark 4.3: Increase student proficiency in math and science*.....  
Teachers scheduled time at each staff development meeting and general staff meeting to demonstrate one math and one science lesson. 90% of teachers identified and shared an effective instructional strategy for math including math imbedded in music, marshmallow geometry and Touch Math. Science lessons will be the focus of SY 00-01.

**Goal 7: Teacher Education and Professional Development**

*Benchmark 7.1: Provide professional development structure for educators*.....  
In-house staff development centers on development of goals and plans by individual staff members. Each plan includes a technology strategy. Implementation included a wide-range of activities such as a work sampling study group, multiage education research, implementation of Kindermusik, investigation of work center usage in 2nd grade setting and desktop publishing.




**Goal 10: Organizational Development**

*Benchmark 10.8: Establish technology for teachers and administrators*.....  
Every teacher's desk is home to a Dell computer linked to in-house email & the Internet through a media center gateway. Plans for next year include installation of printers for student publishing in every classroom and printers primarily for teacher use.
