



Principal's Highlights

Administrators made a alcohol/drug/violence-free learning environment a top priority. Despite few incidents, publicity on these problems nationally caused parents and faculty to request a school resource officer for increased security. Teachers and students alerted administrators to conflicts, but the Safe Schools Student Survey indicated there are drugs not being reported. Parent and student leaders supported the school improvement focus on unity and pride by promoting the motto "Encourage effort, excellence, equity, and ethics." Student Government initiated several new ways to increase school spirit and government classes held mock primaries. Student elections then had record participation.

Faculty ownership, communication, and involvement increased through more required faculty meetings and less committee meetings. The school gave each student a planner, an additional link between home and school. New courses will be offered in response to student requests. ROTC will be career and character building. Modification of the vocational curriculum includes more technology to prepare students for career and college, e.g. ExPan.

Goal 3: Student Achievement And Citizenship

Benchmark 3.10: Demonstrate student technological proficiency.....
Internet access increased to one for every ten students and will be available in every classroom. A fully staffed lab had record use by 1,739 students in one month. Students in the new tech lab applied skills in specialized systems and technologies; e.g. CAD, robotics, digital graphics, video production. All physical science students used an interactive computer lab.

Goal 4: Math And Science Achievement

Benchmark 4.3: Increase student proficiency in math and science.....
Sophomores and juniors showed an increase in Terra Nova percentile scores when compared with last year's 10th and 11th graders. The faculty Diversity Group continued their work to close the ethnic gap, supporting minority students recommended by teachers. They monitored work ethic and met with 8th grade teachers to explain their program for earlier identification.

Goal 7: Teacher Education and Professional Development

Benchmark 7.1: Provide professional development structure for educators.....
SIT was trained and facilitated the faculty's focus on building unity through improved communication and decision-making. The faculty returns a day early to continue this initiative with the training consultants. Follow-up will focus on meeting the needs of diverse learners. A full-time educational technologist worked with teachers to infuse technology into the curriculum.




Benchmark 10.8: Establish technology for teachers and administrators.....
All teachers were trained and began using Outlook; some teachers were trained and began using eClass grading. Computers will be upgraded in the school lab to support all areas of curriculum and instruction, web page development, and desktop publishing. WinSchool training and support are needed for the high school to utilize the program for more than a database.

Benchmark 8.1: Involve/Evaluate Multi-Tiered School-Home Partnership.....
 Parent volunteers called every parent to attend the Parent-Teacher Dialogue. A parent's Marine Regiment adopted the school. Parent and community volunteers worked 6,300 hours supporting the school. The PTO funded recognition programs such as Girls' State, Student Best and Scholar Athletes. The new PTO School Store and the concession stand were services and fund-raisers.
