





Principal's Highlights

Linwood Elementary School had a great year. Linwood had a school-wide celebration in recognition of receiving the 1998-99 U.S. Department of Education National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Award, the Safe and Drug-free School Recognition Program Award, and the Air Force Association Chapter 296 Jane Shirley McGee Excellence in Education Award. The celebration included a school-wide field trip to the Atlanta Braves game to hear the Linwood ES Chorus sing the National Anthem. For the first time in Linwood's history, a sixth grade student placed second in the Georgia District Spelling Bee Contest. Also, a fifth grade student was one of five out of 5,000 entries to win the "In the Back is Where It's At" car safety poster contest. Linwood had great success with the after-school clubs, mentor program, and volunteer program.

Students accomplished the huge task of reading 1,009,074 minutes at home in support of the school-home partnership. A Peer Mediation Program and Character Education lessons were implemented. Social Studies was a focus this year along with critical thinking skills.

Goal 3: Student Achievement And Citizenship

Benchmark 3.10: Demonstrate student technological proficiency.....
Internet connections were made in 3-6 grade classrooms. An electronic portfolio piloting program was established in the fifth grade for 98% of the students. 80% of the students in grades 3-6 have been trained and will be able to engage the Internet 6-Step Process of Research. A baseline in keyboarding was established for grades 4 and 5.

Goal 4: Math And Science Achievement

Benchmark 4.3: Increase student proficiency in math and science.....
A Math Room was created to increase participation in math manipulatives and hands-on activities, problem solving, and critical thinking skills. Increased participation in the Science Fair by including PreK through third grade. Student scores of 80% and above on Science Fair projects increased 7% over last year.

Goal 7: Teacher Education and Professional Development

Benchmark 7.1: Provide professional development structure for educators.....
Training was made available to staff members on character education, technology, developmental therapy, early childhood education, Activities in Math and Science (AIMS), and the new math, art, and music series. Each staff member participated in an Individual Professional Development Plan.




Goal 10: Organizational Development

Benchmark 10.8: Establish technology for teachers and administrators.....
The Education Technologist received training and provided support to the staff. To meet the needs of the faculty, Bare-Bone Classes were held weekly that covered the basics to power-point and beyond. The eClass grades program was introduced to the staff, and an in-service on eClass grades was held to help establish the use of the program in the upcoming school year. 80% of those grade level teachers were in attendance.

Goal 8: Parental Participation
Benchmark 8.1: Involve/Evaluate Multi-Tiered School-Home Partnership.....
 The Blue Ribbon Celebration, Parent University Night, Mentoring Program, Volunteer Program, Jazzy J's Performances, Star Student of the Week, Science Fair, and the International Day Program and Multicultural Night were strong activities. 6,020 volunteer hours reflect a 78% increase. The student home reading activity reached 1,009,074 minutes.
