





Principal's Highlights

Linwood Elementary School received the U.S. Department of Education National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Award and a site visit for the Safe and Drug-free Schools Recognition Program. The Blue Ribbon School award and the Safe & Drug-free visit were an excellent self-evaluation of the quality of education that Linwood provides. Linwood had great success with the after-school clubs, tutors, and mentors. School wide activities included the great American Smoke Out, Fire Prevention Great Escape, Earth Day, Drug Abuse Resistance Education, and Family Fun Field Day. Linwood Chorus continued its public relations by performing at the Atlanta Braves game, Child Abuse Prevention Proclamation Singing, Macon Cherry Blossom Festival, and singing for the Governor of Georgia. Parents continue to volunteer at our school. Spotting Linwood Pride Program which recognizes acceptable student behavior was implemented in support of the Linwood Pride: Making Responsible Choices Discipline Plan.

Goal 3: Student Achievement And Citizenship

Benchmark 3.10: Demonstrate student technological proficiency.

A Pentium Computer was placed in each classroom in grades 3-6. No Internet connections were made in the classrooms or lab. A training logbook was implemented and data collected to establish a baseline for those receiving technological training.

Goal 4: Math And Science Achievement

Benchmark 4.3: Increase student proficiency in math and science.

Teaching the scientific method resulted in 97% of all students achieving apprentice or proficient in critical thinking skills, as assessed using established rubric. Educating parents/students at Family Science Night helped increase science fair scores. This year 14% more students scored over 80% on science projects.

Goal 7: Teacher Education and Professional Development


Benchmark 7.1: Provide professional development structure for educators.

Training was made available to staff and parents on emotional intelligence, technology, developmental therapy, early childhood education, and the new science program. Attendance was recorded at all meetings. A Professional Development Plan was initiated for each staff member with administrative guidance.

Goal 10: Organizational Development

Benchmark 10.8: Establish technology for teachers and administrators.

Education Technologist received training and provided technological instruction to staff members. Forty-two percent of the staff logged seven hundred seventy-two hours of computer training.




Goal 8: Parental Participation

Benchmark 8.1: Implement/Evaluate Multi-Tiered School-Home Partnership




Grade 3
