26 Tips to Keep Your Kids Safe from Abduction

Safety Tips for Children:

1. Know your name, address, and phone numbers.
2. Learn how and when to call 911.
3. If you are afraid of someone, RUN to safety.
4. It's okay to say NO to an adult if you feel you are unsafe.
5. Learn the difference between an "OK" secret and a "NOT OK" secret and beware of an adult who asks you to keep a secret from your parents.
6. Don't let anyone on the phone or at the door know that you are home alone.
7. If you ever get lost in a mall, ask the closest store clerk for help and then stay where you are until you are found.
8. Avoid shortcuts when you are walking from one place to another.
9. If you are ever taken scream, kick, bite and FIGHT as hard as you can to get away! NEVER trust what the person tells you.
10. Tell your parents or a trusted adult if someone is asking you to do something that makes you feel uncomfortable. Listen to your "uh oh" voice.
11. Always ask your parents for permission before getting on the internet.
12. Never talk to people online without your parents' permission.
13. Never fear someone else threatening you to keep a secret and not tell your parents.

Safety Tips for Parents:

1. Work hard to establish trust and communication with your children from day one.
2. Don't ever leave children unattended in a vehicle, whether it is running or not.
3. Make sure you know how to find or contact your children at all times.
4. Have a "Call List" of emergency contacts and make sure your child knows the numbers for who to call if they can't reach you.
5. Take an active role in your children's activities.
6. As tired as you may be, take the time to listen intently to your children when they tell you they had a bad dream. There could be a reason. Trust your instincts.
7. Talk to your children about inappropriate incidences you hear on the news and get their perspectives.
8. Question and monitor anyone who takes an unusual interest in your children.
9. Teach your children that they can be rude to an adult if they feel threatened in any way. They need to hear it from you directly because this message often contradicts everything they have heard before.
10. Teach children the difference between an "OK" secret and a "NOT OK" secret. Assure your children that you would never want them to feel like they should keep a "NOT OK" secret from you.
11. Have your children practice their most annoying scream. They may need to use it someday.
12. Check websites for registered offenders in your neighborhood. Talk to your children about why these people should be avoided.
13. Keep your family computer in a central location that is easily monitored and avoid letting your children have internet access in unsupervised areas (such as computers in their bedrooms).

Pet Policy

"It will be a violation of Board Policy to possess an animal in a Fort Campbell Schools building or on a Fort Campbell Schools campus during school hours or activities, including drop-off or pick-up of students before and after school. School hours are defined as being from 45 minutes prior to the beginning of school in the morning and 45 minutes after the end of school. School activities often take place outside of these hours. Exceptions to this policy are certified harnessed or leased service animals or animals present for an approved educational purpose. In all instances, pets must be handled according to all installation policies. Fort Campbell Schools reserves the right to have any bothersome animal removed from its grounds. Owners are responsible for having their pets leashed or caged and for removing any waste materials from school grounds."

READING



Have you ever heard your child say, "Reading is dumb"?

What your child may be trying to tell you:

- I'm angry that I struggle so much with reading
- I don't see the point in having to work so hard to learn how to read
- I'm not interested in what I'm given to read

How you can respond:

- Acknowledge to your child that he does have to work hard at reading
- Point out the power and practicality of reading in everyday life
- Help your child find reading materials at his reading level that also interest him

Acknowledge to your child that he does have to work hard at reading. Sometimes he may feel very alone in his struggle. Let him know that you are there to support him and ask how you can help. Reassure him that it's okay to feel angry and frustrated sometimes. But also caution him not to let his anger toward his learning difficulties and his struggles with reading limit him or become an excuse for giving up.

Point out the power and practicality of reading in everyday life. It is helpful for a child who is struggling with reading to understand the reward for all of his struggles. By mastering reading, his world will be full of opportunities, from the type of career he chooses to his ability to select an entrée off a restaurant menu. The ability to read enhances everyday experiences.

Help your child find reading materials at his reading level that also interest him. A child who finds reading to be challenging will be even more resistant to read if the subject matter is not appealing to him. It can be a huge challenge to find books at your child's reading level that also interest him. Enlist the help of the reading teachers at your child's school. Consider other types of reading materials such as magazines and computer learning games. Ensure that your child is engaged in the selection process. Keep in mind that you and he can enjoy an interesting book beyond his current independent reading level if you read it aloud to him and then discuss it together.
