

- People drawing, taking pictures of, or measuring important buildings.
- Strangers asking questions about security or building security issues.
- Briefcase, suitcase, backpack, or packages left behind.
- Cars or trucks left in No Parking zones in front of important buildings.
- Intruders in secure areas or “hanging around” where they are not supposed to be.
- A person wearing clothes that are too big or too hot for the weather.
- Chemical smells or fumes that worry you.
- People asking questions about sensitive information such as building blueprints, security plans, or VIP travel schedules without a right or need to know.
- Purchasing supplies / equipment that can be used to make bombs or weapons or acquiring uniforms without proper credentials; stockpiling equipment like this.

School Safety & Security: Standard Response Protocol (SRP)



STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL™

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is a synthesis of common practices in use at a number of districts, departments and agencies. Standard Response Protocol is not a replacement for any school safety plan or program. It is simply a classroom response enhancement for critical incidents, designed to provide consistent, clear, shared language and actions among all students, staff and first responders.

As a standard, SRP is being adopted by emergency managers, law enforcement, school and district administrators and emergency medical services across the country. Hundreds of agencies have evaluated the SRP and recommended the SRP to thousands of schools across the US and Canada.

Barkley's Goals

Goal 1: PLC - Barkley PLCs will have increased activity in Stage 4, Indicator D "Develop lesson plans with differentiation and higher-level cognitive demand tasks" and Stage 5, Indicator D "Develop in class interventions and address gaps (using Formative Assessment Results)".

Goal 2: MATH – Grades K-2 will have 80% of the students meeting expectations (Performance level 3) on DoDEA Americas Math End-of-Year Summative, and **Grades 3-5** will increase the % of proficient students on the CCR Summative Assessment.

Goal 3: LITERACY – Grades K-5 will achieve 60% of students scoring proficient or higher on the Reading Proficiency Test (End-of-Year ORR), and **Grades 3-5** will achieve 50% scoring proficient or higher on the CCRS Summative Assessment.

Goal 4 – Communication & Engagement – Barkley School will increase the number of parents who feel they have been provided with opportunities to provide input/feedback regarding their child's education. Barkley Leadership will also increase the number of staff who feel their input/feedback has been used/considered.

Pet Policy



“It will be a violation of Board Policy to possess an animal in a Fort Campbell Schools building or on a Fort Campbell Schools campus during school hours or activities, including drop-off or pick-up of students before and after school. School hours are defined as being from 45 minutes prior to the beginning of school in the morning and 45 minutes after the end of school. School activities often take place outside of these hours. Exceptions to this policy are certified harnessed or leased service animals or animals present for an approved educational purpose. In all instances, pets must be handled according to all installation policies. Fort Campbell Schools reserves the right to have any bothersome animal removed from its grounds. Owners are responsible for having their pets leashed or caged and for removing any waste materials from school grounds.”

AtHoc is used worldwide for every type of emergency. AtHoc was used during Japan's Fukushima Daiichi nuclear disaster; Microsoft depends on our system to track affected staff during a crisis.

AtHoc enables organizations to communicate with their people through numerous devices, and empowers organizations to create their own permission-based network to establish interoperable communication with other organizations in their community. The result: commercial and government leaders can effectively protect the people and organizations they care about. Around the block, around the world.

Today, AtHoc helps safeguard millions of people and thousands of organizations – including the vast majority of US federal government personnel, leading corporations, industrial giants, healthcare institutions and universities:

If you do not listen through to the end, the program will continue to call you. We only use the program in situations where we need to reach the families of all 600+ students quickly. These include messages sent out by the superintendent, the school board, and our school as needed. Calls are usually made between 4pm and 7pm, unless there is a time factor involved.

Due to increased accountability and increased security measures, Barkley Elementary has Implemented the following policy:



No changes in transportation will be made via telephone.
