What is Autism?

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. We know that there is not one autism but many subtypes, most influenced by a combination of genetic and environmental factors. – Autismspeaks.org

Autism spectrum disorder is more common than childhood cancer, cystic fibrosis, and multiple sclerosis combined.¹

In North Carolina, 1 in 59 children is born with autism spectrum disorder.¹

In North Carolina alone, there are over 60,000 individuals living with ASD.¹

1 in 53 white, 1 in 64 black, 1 in 103 Hispanic, and 1 in 53 Asian or Pacific Islander children was identified with autism spectrum disorder.²

In North Carolina alone, there are over 60,000 individuals living with ASD.¹

59% of children identified were evaluated for developmental concerns by the age of three.²

75% of children are diagnosed with autism or are eligible for autism special education services at school.²

The remaining **25%** of had documented symptoms but were not classified by a community provider.²



¡HOLA AMIGOS!

¡Hola! We are continuing to study Unit 4 in the Spanish FLES classrooms. Unit 4 focuses on “The World Around Us”. The key questions are as follows: “What is happening in the world around us?” and “How does it affect me?”

The kindergartners continue to practice the alphabet. They compared the alphabet song in English to the song with the similar melody in Spanish. In addition, students have learned the 2D shapes: círculo, rectángulo, triángulo, medialuna, and pentágono. The students also played “Shape Bingo.”

The first graders have been practicing saying time to the hour with a Bingo activity that focuses on reading analog and digital clocks. Students are also working on adding and subtracting within five in Spanish.

All the students listened to Dr. Seuss’s book Green Eggs and Ham in Spanish. We focused on the rhyming words in the story. The students made connections by comparing and contrasting the story in English and Spanish.



EVERY CHILD IS AN ARTIST

We are printing in a different way. We are printing like people did over a hundred years ago in Japan. The fishermen in Japan record the exact size and species of fish they had caught. Today, sports fishermen often display *gyotaku* as wall decorations in their home. We are printing these fish on paper. The traditional Japanese method of *gyotaku* is created by pressing rice paper onto a fish covered with ink or paint.


