

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL REMINDERS

As you plan your family's morning routine, please be mindful that our school day begins at 8:15. Hampton students should enter the building by 8:10 which allows time to arrive in class before the tardy bell rings.

Staff members who supervise the drop off area enter the building when the tardy bell rings. Students must be signed in at the front office by a parent after that time. Please do not drop students off at the curb after staff members have left the drop off area.

Students who plan to eat breakfast at school may arrive as early as 7:45. Breakfast is served until 8:10. Students who are not eating breakfast should not be dropped off earlier than 8:00.

Students arriving or leaving in the car rider line should exit and enter on the passenger side only. This is a safety measure. Whether driving or walking for pickup, remember that Hampton requires a 100% ID check for student pickup. Please be mindful of traffic patterns on the driveway and walkways.

School dismisses on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday at 2:45. Every Wednesday is an "early release" with a dismissal time of 1:50 PM. Please mark your calendars and note the school hours to the right.

NURSE'S NOTES

Greetings from your new school nurse! I am here at Hampton Primary School with pride, ready to serve the children, parents and staff. My primary role as the school nurse is promoting health, academic success, and the lifelong achievement of your students.

The best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get vaccinated every year. The influenza vaccine is a required immunization for students attending DoDEA schools, following guidance and recommendations by the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices and the Department of Defense Joint Military Medical Services regulation on immunizations. Fort Bragg Schools will be hosting four Flu Vaccine Clinics. The dates are October 17th at Gordon Elementary in Linden Oaks, October 24th at Bowley Elementary on main cantonment, November 7th at Devers Elementary on main cantonment, and November 14th at Shughart Elementary in Linden Oaks. The times for all of the Fort Bragg School clinics is 2:00 pm - 5:00 pm. You can take your child to any of the locations listed to be vaccinated or you can take your child to the immunization clinic. Once the vaccination is received, please provide documentation of the immunization to the school nurse office.

Regular school attendance is crucial for school success, but there are times when students need to stay home due to illness. The following list from DODEA can guide you as you determine when your child must stay home:

- Fever of $\geq 100^\circ$
- Vomiting and/or Diarrhea
- Symptoms of Conjunctivitis or Impetigo
- Uncontrollable coughing
- Rash with Fever

North Carolina Child Safety Seat Laws

Restraint Requirements: A properly used car seat or booster seat is required for children less than age 8 and less than 80 pounds.

When a child reaches age 8 (regardless of weight) or 80 pounds (regardless of age), a properly fitted seat belt can be used in place of a car seat or booster seat.

Booster seats can only be used with lap and shoulder seat belts. They can NEVER be used with a lap belt only. A child who weighs at least 40 pounds can legally be restrained using only a properly fitted lap belt if there is no lap and shoulder belt available for use with a booster seat, however this is not considered to be the safest option.

Position In Vehicle: Children less than age 5 and less than 40 pounds must be restrained in the back seat if the vehicle has a passenger side front airbag and has a rear seat.




EVERY CHILD IS AN ARTIST

Greetings from the FLES Spanish teachers!
FLES stands for Foreign Languages in Elementary Schools.

Ms. Mancini is teaching kindergarten and first grade FLES again this year. Ms. Gregg is our new FLES teacher. She has a minor in Spanish from Western Michigan University and taught two years in Honduras in Central America. She also taught two years in a kindergarten bilingual class in North Carolina. Most recently, she taught English as a Second Language for 7 years in South Korea.

Our first Unit in Spanish for kindergarten and first grade is “Mi escuela y yo (Me and My School).” The objective of the first unit is to provide engaging activities that will motivate the students to have fun while learning the Spanish language. The students are introduced to routines and rules for the Spanish studios. In kindergarten we introduce the basics of Spanish: greetings, numbers 0-10, 2-D shapes, and classroom objects. The first graders review and expand their vocabulary about places around the school, supplies, shapes, and numbers.

The broadcast team consists of a group of 1st grade students working with the Information Specialist, Mrs. Horosko and the Educational Technologist, Mrs. Eaton. The students rotate every four weeks. In order to become a Broadcast Team member, first graders are nominated by their teacher, must complete an application, and obtain a letter of permission from parents.

Special guests, to include staff and students from all grade levels, visit the studio to report on current projects and school activities. Broadcast Team members have opportunities to learn about scripts, teleprompters, cameras, microphones, audio controls, stage lighting, backgrounds, green screens, recording, and live streaming.


