Call to Order - The meeting was called to order at 4:02pm by HMS Principal Tiffiney Weddle.

Review of Year End Report SY19-20 - The End of Year Report was made available with the meeting announcement. There were no changes/adjustments recommended. There was a question of the election to follow Robert's Rules of Order. Election ballots for SAC membership will be sent out with a deadline to submit by next week.

Introduction of participants - All participants introduced themselves including their respective connection to HMS.

Election of Officers - Due to members not being officially elected, election of officers will be postponed as well.

Principal's Report - The current enrollment at HMS is 905 students.

Transition to brick and mortar has gone quite well.

HMS students will have the opportunity to attend the HHS Homecoming Parade.

Teachers have a work day on October 23 since the quarter ends on October 22.

Picture days have been scheduled for November 24.

Student Council elections will take place soon.

The PTO has been active especially with transition activities as we moved from remote learning back to brick and mortar.

The first day of school in the brick and mortar setting was amazing with our own Phoenix mascot as well as a clap-in of soldiers. The students (and staff) really enjoyed it.

Garrison Command Report - Col. Tremblay stated that he has had great reports about HMS. He also mentioned the Homecoming Parade.

SLO - Items for the Phoenix Ambassadors were dropped off to Ms. Hampton. MWR is having open gyms from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. daily. On Oct. 31st, Trunk or Treat will take place.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

COVID mitigation - The following measures have been established at HMS to address COVID:

- signs all over
- personal protection barriers
- sanitation stations outside of each door
- limited restroom use
- semi-permanent barriers in library, labs, cafeteria and office
- distance stickers on the floor
- masks required with extras available to ensure 100% use
- band, choir, PE outside as much as possible

An inquiry was made about the use of balls, frisbees, etc. during recess/lunch. Per DSO, this is not allowed at this time. The garrison commander stated that doctors are looking into the leveling of mitigation measures and determining what science tells us. We want to allow kids to be kids as much as possible but the DSO guidelines must be followed.

The Garrison is preparing for winter break and proper quarantining needs.
