AVID	Advancement Via Individual Determination is an in-school academic support program for grades 4 – 12 that prepares students for college eligibility and success for all students, but it targets those in the academic middle with GPA's within the range of 2.5-3.5. AVID is implemented school-wide, district-wide and DoDEA-wide. AVID students are students in the academic middle, capable of completing a college preparatory path with support. These students often are not realizing their full potential academically. In the identification process a number of criteria are considered, including: State Test Scores, Grades, Citizenship, Attendance, Desire and Determination, First in Family to Attend College, Historically Underrepresented in 4-year Colleges, Economically Disadvantaged or other Special Circumstances.
