- **Virtual School/F2F Option:**
 - NOV 6 was the last day for families to choose Virtual or Brick & Mortar for Spring Semester. On Dec 18, the school will be notified regarding the number of students and staff returning to KBHS. This will likely result in some changes to the master schedule. Hopefully we'll get all the kids back in class at Kubasaki. In February, we will begin to look at staffing for SY21-22. The rezoning hasn't changed our population much. This has been better for limiting Covid, but not good for staffing and class offering.
- **1st and 2nd Semester Sports**
 - 1st Semester: cross country, tennis, golf, cheerleading
 - 2nd Semester: baseball, softball, track, soccer and possibly cheerleading. Cheerleaders are working on a proposal to continue through 2nd Semester.
 - Volleyball club ends in January
 - Are sports physicals required for Club Volleyball? Grubbs/Alvarado are running the club. The nurse will share with them information for physicals..
 - (Mizell) The volleyball club had been practicing on the beach. Ms. Mizell requested command permission to get them moved into the gym so that they can catch the activity bus. PAC South Superintendent approved.
- **Mitigation Strategies and Supplies:**
 - Students are mostly doing the right thing. Addressing mask issues with the movie that reteaches how to wear the mask. We have plenty of supplies. There is no shortage.
- **Kudos to Community-:**
 - Parents feel very comfortable coming in with concerns. Because of this, we have not had many ice comments. Instead, we've had lots of positive comments.
 - General Bowers is very supportive. Much is shared in our monthly lunch meeting. He plans to sing our praises to the Commandant during his visit. Mrs. Clardy and GO spouses will visit Kubasaki in December.
 - Parents have been very supportive of our daily scans for Covid symptoms.
- **Free Lunch**
 - (Huff) Lunch is good but we'd like portions more for teenagers and more variety would be nice. It is just the same menu rotation.
 - (Leopold) We'd like a price list available for a la carte.
 - Nurse Holly has given the list of students with allergies to the kitchen. They will allow those students to substitute what will fit in with their diet. Now we free lunch, fewer students arriving in the nurse's office who don't feel well because they haven't eaten.
 - (Mizell) AAFES follows nutritional guidelines. When they send out the yearly survey, it's important to fill it out.
 - (Leopold) Bacon bits on the salads are a problem for vegetarians. Nurse Holly will contact the cafeteria manager to ensure fully vegetarian options at every meal.
- **Assessments:**
 - Interims starting this week in ELA and math
 - PSAT was completed last month
 - Mr. Strait showed our most recent AP and SAT scores

 - Ms. Lowry & I are working behind the scene to create the agenda. But, would really like to have a chair.

- **Freedom of Speech/Election Day**

- **Mock election – ballot with real issues good experience for students**

- **Freedom of Speech/Election Day:** On the day of our national election, students with U.S. flags, a Trump flag, and a Thin Blue Line flag were asked to put them away because they were a distraction in school. After school they took them out and took a picture in front of the dragon wings. They disbursed quickly with no issue. The images were posted to social media and complaints were made. We sat down with students and parents and got the issues ironed out. Some of the group had their masks off. We told them that expressing their political thoughts was okay, but not wearing masks was a problem.

- **Acts of Kindness/Anti-Bullying Campaign/Red Ribbon Week**

- Ms. Pilon and Dr. Jackson led these very successful activities. The Acts of Kindness and rewards continue throughout the remainder of the year.
- Gen Bowers, with AFN, signed the Anti-Bullying Pledge Wall and spoke with students regarding the topic.
- Military mentors were a big help with lunchtime activities around these campaigns.

- **Veteran's Day Tribute**

- With help from our staff and stakeholders, we have put together a video to honor Veterans. Tomorrow, Veterans Day, a video compiled of pictures from our staff and community, will be posted on our social media sites. The message is very educational and teaches all about how Armistice Day became Veteran's Day and, the difference between Veteran's Day, Memorial Day, and Armed Forces Day. Students will view this in seminar on Friday.

- **Cheer Off – Kubasaki & Kadena**

- Cheerleaders and drum line will compete at Mike Petty Stadium NOV 20 at 6:00 pm. For socially distanced protocol, this will be a ticketed event with just families allowed attendance.

- **Far East Events**

- NOV 20 @ 4:00 Virtual Cross Country Meet at Mike Petty Stadium. All runners in the Pacific will run on tracks and send in times to determine the Far East Champions.
- JROTC Virtual Drill/Color Guard Meet will be filmed in the next few weeks. The film will then be sent in to be judged for Far East Championship determination.
- Tennis – The Pacific South District Tournament will be held next week at Kubasaki.

- The end of the year golf tournament will be held at Banyan Tree with parents participating. This will be followed with an outside banquet.
 - PTSO will give funds for cakes for all end of season clubs and sports.
- **School Nurse, Holly Gouldman**
 - COVID-19 – numbers are looking better than this time last month
 - Mitigation measures are working
 - Did a walk around campus with Ms. Pilon and put together a video that will be presented in seminar in Friday regarding how to wear a mask properly.
 - We must count on each other to keep our school community safe.
 - (Mizell) MCIPAC has no firm date on when Navy will get the flu vaccine supply. The vaccine hasn't even been shipped yet.
 - (Gouldman) Marine families won't be held to the DoDEA DEC 1 deadline. Once it arrives, we are looking at having a drive up clinic at Kubasaki High School.
 - Flu shot may give flu/Covid like symptoms. It would be best to have the clinic on a Friday.
- **School Liaison - Diana Mizell**
 - Working with the Region on delayed PCSing families. Most of the issues, such as expired DEROS dates, are solvable.
 - Monthly lunch w/Gen Bowers. He is extremely involved with Kubasaki and impressed with what is going on here. Ms. Rapp and Mr. Journey want to have a meeting with him.
 - Good news about Kubasaki has gone all the way to Tom Brady at headquarters via Marine Corps Installations Command.
 - Dec 11 Ms. Clardy and all the general's spouses will be touring Kubasaki
 - ODAC is scheduled for next Friday, NOV 20
 - 2nd semester cheer – If requesting to add the sport, have them get the information to Ms. Mizell so that she can begin the process to get approval from Col Hammond.
 - Dolphin Swim Team: Sports such as swimming, can earn a varsity letter. General Bowers attends every swim meet. There are two seasons per semester with tryouts for each one. There is a bus that provides transportation from Kubasaki to the pool.
 - Lilly – we can add this to announcements
 - Lacrosse gives the same opportunity
 - Gate One is being used instead of the SGT Maj gate for the activity bus. Times are being monitored to assess its success at keeping travel times down.
 - Tearing down of old Zukeran has begun. No dates are available for completion.
 - (Leibee) Baseball used a fenced in area there for batting practice. Is it still accessible?
 - (Mizell) It is not available, but Seabees built batting cage outside field one. It is available for use.
