

Margaret Holland Scholarship Fund

The Margaret Holland Scholarship Fund rewards high school seniors who demonstrate superior academic ability, a high moral character, are leaders at Lejeune High School and in the community, and possess a financial need. The scholarship was created by Ms. Margaret Holland, retired teacher of Lejeune High School, as a gift for the future of students of LHS. Through this scholarship, it was the intent of Ms. Holland to create a life changing experience for its recipients.

Eligibility requirements:

- Enrolled at LHS for his/her 12th grade year.
- Planning to attend a regionally accredited course of study at any post-secondary institution, including a community college or a junior college.
- Planning to be a full-time college student.



Margaret Holland devoted her life to her students. After graduating from James Madison University, Ms. Holland served military families by working as both a Spanish and English teacher in Germany and Okinawa. Her combination of teaching expertise and fondness for students motivated her to become a Guidance Counselor at Lejeune High School. Ms. Holland spent the majority of her career at Lejeune, making a difference in the lives of countless students who walked the halls of LHS.

Now and in the future, Ms. Holland's legacy will live on through her scholarship so that all students who walk these halls have an equal opportunity to be touched by her life.

Ms. Holland was an inspiration to students, many of whom remained in contact with her long after their graduation. Her exceptional love for incoming freshman put her in the ideal place to make a difference in the lives of students as they began their high school careers. Stories of students who once considered school to be a burden, finding a new love and appreciation for school, are often told as fond memories of Ms. Holland.

To her co-workers, Margaret was a quiet, private individual who had a reputation for being well dressed and always having a neat appearance. Margaret believed that becoming a member of a school faculty was like becoming a member of a family. The 30+ years Margaret spent at LHS undoubtedly generated lifelong relationships and a family tree consisting of faculty, staff, administration, and former students. Even after her retirement, Margaret continued to serve her LHS family by volunteering weekly at the school.

Because Ms. Holland enjoyed such a reserved, unassuming life, few people knew about her amazing contributions to many causes. Margaret's concern for her fellow man and desire to help others is evident in her philanthropy. Through her estate, she left monetary donations to more than ten different charities including the Ronald McDonald House, Special Olympics of North Carolina, and Habitat for Humanity. Her donations will not only make a difference in the lives of those connected with these organizations, but will also assist in the advancement of medical research and so much more.

It was Ms. Holland's desire to leave a legacy that would ensure her greatest contribution would benefit the students of the school she considered family - Lejeune High School. She established the Margaret Holland Scholarship Fund, yielding up to \$32k per year, to give LHS seniors an opportunity for a life changing experience. Her desire was to pave the way for deserving students, who may not be able to afford college, the means to do so. She believed that all students who want to go to college deserve a fair chance, thereby warranting her help.

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Eligibility requirements:

- Enrolled at LHS for his/her entire 12th grade year within thirty (30) days from the first regular school day of said year **OR** a previous Margaret Holland Scholarship winner.
- Planning to attend a regionally accredited course of study at any post-secondary institution, including a community college, junior college, or trade school.
- Planning to be a full-time post-secondary student.

The scholarship will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- Demonstrated financial need by providing the current year FAFSA form showing the EFC.
- Write a letter to Margaret Holland that articulates how winning this scholarship: would be a life changing experience **OR** has been a life changing experience.
- Evidence of high moral character through the following:
 - Recommendation letters – A total of two (2) letters to be written by one (1) teacher and one (1) community representative or second teacher. Letters must be written within the last 6 months.
- Potential interview (for Finalists).

The scholarship packet (application, the Letter to Margaret, transcripts, FAFSA page showing EFC, Cost of Attendance print out for top 3 schools, Recommendation Letters, and Award Letters from the school if available), must be turned into Lejeune High school Student Services on or before March 31st of each year. All scholarship winners must submit their second semester transcripts to the committee no later than July 1st of the year awarded to confirm GPA eligibility and release monies. Any winners who do not submit their transcripts by July 1st will forfeit their award.

All information submitted by the applicant will be used in the selection of the award recipient(s). Failure to submit a completed application package will prevent applicant from being considered for the award.

The scholarship committee has authority to award funds to as many or as few students as it deems necessary. Scholarship winners may reapply the following school year with an updated application package.
