INSTRUCTIONS TO RECIPIENTS


The following pen-and-ink changes to DS Regulation 1300.1, "DoDDS Organization, " August 2C, 1985, have been authorized:

A. PURPOSE

This regulation establishes five Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS) regions, identifies the location of each regional office, and identifies the nineteen authorized chief school administrator (CSA) offices. Responsibilities for publishing regional manuals outlining the organization and functions of the regional and chief school administrator (CSA) offices, feeder plans, and changes to the published list of schools are delineated, as well as broad operational responsibilities for regional directors.

B. POLICY

1. The following regions are hereby established:

a. The Department of Defense Dependents Schools, Atlantic (DoDDS-A), operates schools in Belgium, Bermuda, Canada (including Newfoundland), Cuba: England, Iceland, Netherlands, Norway, Scotland, and the West Indies (including Antigua). DoDDS-A is also responsible for providing tuition assistance to eligible dependents unable to receive an appropriate education in a DoDDS-operated school in these countries (except the Caribbean and West Indies) and in Denmark, Finland, Ireland, and Sweden. The regional office is located in Eastcote; England.

b. The Department of Defense Dependents Schools, Germany (DoDDS-G), operates schools in West Germany and West Berlin and is responsible for providing tuition assistance, as appropriate, in these locations as well as in Austria, Czechoslovakia, France, Hungary, Luxemborg, Poland, Rumania, Switzerland, and the USSR. The regional office is located in Miesbaden, West Germany.

c. The Department of Defense Dependents Schools, Mediterranean (DoDDS-M), operates schools in Portugal (including Azores), Spain, Italy, Greece (including Crete), Turkey, and Bahrain. It has responsibility for tuition assistance, as appropriate, in these countries and in Albania, Bulgaria, Malta, Yugoslavia, all countries in the continent of Africa to include the island nations of the Malagasy Republic, the Comoros, and the Seychelles, and in Asia to the land border of Pakistan and India to include Cyprus. The regional office is located in Madrid, Spain.

d. The Department of Defense Dependents Schools, Pacific (DoDDS-PA), operates schools in Korea; Philippines, and Japan, including Okinawa. It is responsible for providing tuition assistance, as appropriate, in these countries and in Australia, Bangladesh, Burma, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nepal, New Zealand, Pakistan, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and in the island countries of the Pacific and Indian Oceans not mentioned elsewhere in this regulation. The regional office is located in Ojana, Okinawa, Japan.

e. The Department of Defense Dependents Schools, Panama (DoDDS-PN), operates schools in the Republic of Panama. It is responsible for providing tuition assistance, as appropriate, in this country and in the Caribbean, Central and South America, and the West Indies. The regional office is located at Albrook Air Force Station, Republic of Panama.

2. The following CSA offices are established: CSA-Benenor, CSA-Islands, CSA-UK West Area, CSA-UK East Area, CSA-Bad Kreuznach, CSA-Bremerhaven, CSA-Frankfurt, CSA-Kaiserslautern, CSA-Karlsruhe, CSA-Munich, CSA-Nuernberg, CSA-Stuttgart, CSA-Greece/Turkey/Bahrain, CSA-Italy, CSA-Spain/Portugal, CSA-Japan, CSA-Korea, CSA-Okinawa, and CSA-Philippines.

C. RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Chief, Executive Services Division, Office of Dependents Schools, will publish and distribute annually a list of schools and dormitories and a feeder plan for 5- and 7-day dormitories.

2. The regional directors will:

a. Provide educational services for authorized dependents.

b. Issue a manual describing, in detail, the organization and functions of both the regional office (by division) and CSA offices (including individual school assignments to each CSA) within the region. Six copies of the initial manual will be submitted to the Director, DoDDS, within 90 days of the date of publication of this Regulation. Thereafter, the manual will be updated and submitted to the Director, DoDDS, by April 15 of each year.

c. Submit changes to the official list of schools issued by ODS in accordance with reference (d).

d. Develop feeder plans for all schools within their regions, including 5- and 7-day dormitories. These plans should show all receiving and attending schools in accordance with the attachment. In the event that the feeder plan for a particular school crosses regional boundaries, or an exception to a dormitory assignment is requested which crosses regional boundaries, appropriate coordination will be accomplished between the regional directors involved. Regional directors will keep ODS currently informed of changes" to the- feeder plans and will annually furnish two copies of the plans to the Director, DoDDS, by April 15.

e. Provide by April 15 of each year the following information concerning 5- and 7-day dormitories to the Director, DoDDS:

- (1) Location of dormitories.
- (2) Capacity for boys.
- (3) Projected enrollment of boys for the following school year (space required).
- (4) Capacity for girls.
- (5) Projected enrollment for girls for the following school year (space required).
- (6) Military base on which located; i.e., Army, Navy, or Air Force.
- (7) Cities and countries feeding into each dormitory.

D. EFFECTIVE DATE

This regulation is effective 60 days after publication. Two copies of implementing instructions, if any, shall be forwarded within 60 days.
