


McGraw-Hill Connect: Accessing the Read Aloud Feature

1. The student should log into their DoDEA Schoology account via <https://schoology.dodea.edu/>.
2. Look on the left hand side. Click the “McGraw-Hill Education” link.



3. McGraw-Hill connectED will open in a new window.

4. Select the student edition of your textbook (students should only see the textbooks for their registered courses).
