## Accreditation

With the opening of a new campus, Stuttgart High School was established in 2015 as part of the Department of Defense Dependents Schools. The school is part of the Europe East District, which earned accreditation by the AdvancedEd in 2018. Previously called Patch High School, the most recent on-site visit was SY Spring 2018.

Stuttgart High School is located on a United States Army post on the southern edge of Stuttgart, Germany, a one-hour drive from the French border and a three-hour drive from the Austrian and Swiss borders. Stuttgart is in the center of many historical and recreational areas. Community members consist of U.S. Armed Forces personnel and Department of Defense civilians assigned to the Stuttgart Army Garrison, United States European Command, Africa Command, and various support groups. Many parents are college graduates with graduate level degrees.

Stuttgart High School operates on an eight period block schedule. In addition to courses in Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, French, Spanish and German, we offer a variety of other courses that include Honors Language Arts 9/10, Honors Global History & Geography 1/11, Achievement Via Individual Determination (AVID), Fine Arts, Career and Technical Education, Computer Technology/Computer Science, Chorus, Band, Army Junior ROTC, and Career Practicum.

School Year 2017-2018 Advanced Placement courses offered: AP Seminar, AP Research, AP World History, AP U.S. History, AP U.S. Government, AP Human Geography, AP English Literature, AP English Language, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics Parts I, AP Environmental Science, AP Calculus AB/BC, AP Statistics, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Psychology, AP German, AP Spanish, and AP Art Studio—2D Drawing, and Drawing.

Extra-Curricular activities are conducted outside of class time. Organizations meet at lunch or after school. Stuttgart High School sponsors the following activities: American Sign Language, Anime Club, Biology Club, Chemistry Club, Chess Club, Culinary Arts Enrichment, Dance Team, Debate Team, Drama, Drumline, Educators Rising, Environmental Club, FBLA, Freshman Class, German Honor Society, Humanities Club, Junior Science and Humanities Symposium, KIVA, Music Honors Club, National Honors Society, Pep Band, Poet's Corner, Pride Club (Gay Straight Alliance), Quill and Scroll Honor Society, Red Cross Club, Red Ribbon Week, Robotics/STEM, S2S Ambassador, Spanish Club, Spanish Honor Society, Tri-M Honors, Video Club, Student Council, Freshman Class, Sophomore Class, Junior Class and Senior Class. Athletic teams include: Baseball, Girls and Boys Basketball, Cheer, Cross Country, Drill Team, Football, Golf, Rifle Team, Girls and Boys Soccer, Softball, Stuttgart Piranhas Swim Team, Tennis, Track and Field, Girls Volleyball and Girls and Boys Wrestling.

## Grading Scale

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Weighted Classes: AP (Advanced Placement) and IB (second year higher-level classes) are weighted.

Grade Point Average: GPA is based on a 4-point system. An "A" is worth 4 points, a "B" grade is 3 points, etc. For each AP (Advanced Placement) course, add 1 additional point (e.g. A=5) unless the grade is "F" in which case no points are given. Class rankings for graduation will be determined following the second semester of the senior year for students enrolled full-time at the end of the fourth quarter.

Honors Classes and standard level IB courses from DoDEA schools and Non-DoDEA schools are not weighted in the GPA and ranking.

## Graduation Requirements

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Seniors must have earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher to receive a high school diploma from a DoDEA high school. In addition, math requirements include: Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and an elective with a course code of 400 or higher. Three credits must be earned during grades 9-12

**Honors Diploma Requirements** include: 4 AP Courses, 3.8 cumulative GPA, 0.5 credit Economic Literacy in CTE, Social Studies, Science, or Math as well as the requirements for the regular DoDEA diploma.
