

## Kubasaki High School's SgtMaj Brent Cook (Ret.) named Marine Corps JROTC Instructor of the Year

Kubasaki High School Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (MCJROTC) Instructor SgtMaj Brent Cook (Ret.) was named the service's Instructor of the Year on June 24, 2024.
